5. Luke 9:45 says that "they did not understand" what Jesus had said, and that "it was concealed from them, so that they might not perceive it." Based on your understanding of good theology, why didn't they understand? And why was it concealed from them? What would it take for them to fully believe?

Thinking Deeper & Taking It Home

Craig mentioned on Sunday that in this week's text Jesus is warning us against partial belief in who He is. In what ways do people "partially believe" in Jesus? What things keep us from deeper faith and fully believing in Jesus?

This Morning in God's Word

We welcome Mr. Craig Alford to our pulpit this morning. Craig, his wife Julie, and daughter Vivian visited us back in January, and our Elders have asked him to return this weekend for further ministry and conversation. Today's Text: Luke 9:37-45

Our text today finds Jesus nearing the end of His ministry in Galilee, soon to "set His face to go to Jerusalem" (9:51). Luke's big-picture goal in presenting his account of the life of Jesus, of course, is "that you may have certainty" about the person and work of Jesus. Jesus' identity is always a key part of the text. Earlier in chapter 9 we find Jesus asking His disciples, "Who do you say I am?" In our main text, we will find Jesus warning us, His hearers, against partial belief in who He is. Today's text addresses this by setting two aspects of Jesus's character side by side.

Jesus Has Authority to Heal (37-43a)

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Jesus Is the Son of Man (43b-45)
